Worldwide business revenue, including technology development, laboratory operations and technology commercialization, totaled \$3.4 billion in FY05.

During FY05, there were 3,275 projects in progress at Battelle for 1,153 government and industry clients.

In 2005, *R&D Magazine* selected 11 developments from Battelle, Pacific Northwest National Laboratory, Brookhaven National Laboratory, Oak Ridge National Laboratory, Idaho National Laboratory and the National Renewable Energy Laboratory among the year's most significant innovations worldwide.

Our all-time R&D 100 Awards total reached 141.

In FY05, 160 Battelle staff were named on 79 patents, 63 of which were issued to Battelle, and 242 Battelle staff were honored for their efforts in technology development and commercialization.
